

In the spring of 2008, a group of students from Concordia Theological Seminary-Fort Wayne were given the opportunity to travel to Lutheran Theological Seminary in Pretoria (Tshwane), South Africa.

Students were brought to LTS from several African countries, educated in the Scriptures and Lutheran Confessions, and sent home in order to be ordained as pastors in their own communities.
