Annual meeting: 20th February 2016.

We are grateful for all support you have given to them and through them to this project. We are hopeful that it will be finished by Easter. Renate has cooked for the Seminary for over 5 years and I don't know, whether we've had the same recipe for lunch ever. It sure makes for some delightful discoveries. Thank you Hans and Renate.
 - 2. Berno and Karin Niebuhr continue to be stalwarts on the Seminary front. Berno is the treasurer of our Board and has helped us navigate countless pitfalls and challenges. Karin together with her sister Imke have started a Day-Care-Centre at the LTS mainly for student's children, but obviously outreach to the community is part of the game too. They are going from strength to strength and its a joy to see their successful and flourishing story. Thank you Berno and Karin.
 - 3. **Hugo and Rosa Meyer** have donated pork to the Seminarians time and again. This makes for good eating, but also for happy students and staff even if we have a number of those,

 - 4. Rev. Orapeleng Shuping is doing secretarial work and teaching liturgical singing.
 - 5. Rev. Dr. Karl Böhmer is teaching Reformation History.
 - 6. Rev. Muzein Teferea from Mekane Yesous teaching the distance education course.
 - 7. Tutor Eric Gbotoe is teaching OT Bibs I together with Rev. Dr. Sibongisile E. Sithole
 - 8. Tutor Robert van Niekerk from UP is teaching Greek Grammar
 - 9. Tutor Henk Labuschagne from UP teaching Hebrew Grammar
 - 10. Tutor Thandeka Maseko from UP is doing Academic Skills.
